Overview

Job Board Searches and Clicks

→ Last week, search activity rose by 6%, while click activity increased by 4%.

Spot Freight Market

- → Overall average spot rates (including fuel) decreased by 3 cents from the previous week.
- → Total load postings rose by 1%.
- → Overall truck availability decreased by 1%.

Story of the Week

A group of carriers has requested that hair drug testing results be reported to FMCSA's Drug and Alcohol Clearinghouse.

→ Currently, fleets can use the results of hair testing internally to screen drivers but are prohibited from reporting these results at the federal level.

Hair testing has a longer look-back window compared to urine tests, which yields more positive results for hard drugs.





This Week in Spot Freight

Spot rates and volume were mixed in the latest week.²

Overall spot rates (including fuel) decreased by 3 cents from the previous week.

Dry Van: +1¢ WoW | Refrigerated -3¢ WoW | Flatbed -4¢ WoW

→ Excluding fuel surcharges, overall spot rates are down 24% year over year.


Total load postings rose by 1% from the previous week.

Dry Van +4% WoW | Refrigerated +11% WoW | Flatbed -4% WoW

- → Load postings were mixed by region.
 - ◆ Volume was down in the three largest regions by volume (Midwest, Southeast, South Central).
 - ♦ Volume was up 19% on the West Coast

Overall truck availability decreased by 1% from the previous week.

→ The overall load-to-truck ratio edged higher, its first week-over-week increase in 10 weeks.

Story of the Week

Trucking Alliance requests hair drug test results be reported to Clearinghouse³

- → The Federal Motor Carrier Safety Administration (FMCSA) is accepting public comments to amend federal regulations surrounding drug testing.
 - ◆ The Trucking Alliance, a group of large carriers, has requested that hair drug testing results be reported to FMCSA's Drug and Alcohol Clearinghouse.
- → FMCSA lacks the authority to grant the exemption until further action is taken by the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services (HHS).
 - Current federal law requires truck drivers to be tested via a urine sample.
 - ◆ Currently, fleets can use the results of hair testing internally to screen drivers but are prohibited from reporting these results at the federal level.
- → Hair testing has a longer look-back window compared to urine tests.
 - ◆ Hair tests can find drug use going back about 90 days, compared to a few days to a few weeks depending on the drug with urine tests.
 - ♦ Hair tests yield more positive tests for hard drugs like cocaine, opioids, and meth.
