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# **Overview**

#### **Job Board Searches and Clicks**

→ Last week, search activity fell by 17%, while click activity decreased by 12%.

# **Spot Freight Market**

- → Overall average spot rates (including fuel) decreased by 8 cents from the previous week.
- → Total load postings rose by 17%.
  - This was consistent with increases typically seen during the week following the Labor Day holiday week.
- → Overall truck availability increased by 13%.

## Story of the Week

A group of senators has introduced a bill that would require overtime pay for truck drivers.

→ The bills seek to remove the motor carrier provision from the Fair Labor Standards Act.




▲ Up 11%

→ Last week's drop in searches and clicks suggests lower driver interest in finding new trucking jobs. It is worth monitoring to see if this is a one-week aberration or the start of a new trend.

# This Week in Spot Freight

Spot rates fall, volume rebounds in the latest week.<sup>2</sup>

Overall spot rates (including fuel) fell 8 cents from the previous week.

Dry Van: -8¢ WoW | Refrigerated: -12¢ WoW | Flatbed: -7¢ WoW

- → A decline is typical after the Labor Day holiday week.
- → Excluding fuel surcharges, rates were 27% below the same week last year.

Total load postings rose by 17% from the previous week.

Dry Van: +22% WoW | Refrigerated: +13% WoW | Flatbed: +17% WoW

- → This is similar to increases typically seen the week after the Labor Day holiday week.
- → Dry Van's sharp rebound was greater than is typically seen during the week following the holiday, perhaps due to the rail labor stand-off last week.
- → Load postings rose sharply in all regions.

Overall truck availability increased by 13% from the previous week.

→ The overall load-to-truck ratio increased to its strongest level in seven weeks.

# Story of the Week

# New Bill takes aim at truckers' overtime exemption.<sup>3</sup>

- → A group of senators has introduced a bill that would require overtime pay for truck drivers.
  - ◆ The bill is companion legislation to a bill introduced in the House in April.
- → The bills seek to remove the motor carrier provision from the Fair Labor Standards Act, which excludes many commercial truck operators from overtime protections.
  - ◆ The bill's authors say that trucking's pay structure is the cause for the often-cited truck driver shortage.
  - They argue that increasing pay is the simplest way to recruit and retain drivers, and eliminating the overtime exemption is a way to increase pay.
- → The legislation has the support of the International Brotherhood of Teamsters, Owner-Operator Independent Drivers Association, and other groups.
